Caution Money	All exchange students are required to sign a credit card payment authorization form of HK \$500 to cover utilities expenses, e.g. library fine, restoration of damage at hostel induced by student, if there's any, during their stay at HKIEd. The charge will only be proceed should there's any outstanding payment at the end of students' staying term and that the students have left HKIEd. Students will be notified of the amount to be charged by email before the transaction and the authorization form will be destroyed after the transaction (if any) is cleared. HKIEd may withhold student's transcript until the outstanding payment (if any) is settled.		
Insurance	It is mandatory for exchange students to make their own arrangements for travel and health insurance cover the entire period of studies in Hong Kong. Insurance coverage should include (but not limited to) travel, personal accident, medical expenses (accident and non-accident), hospitalization and emergency evacuation/repatriation, etc. Students are required to provide proof of coverage prior to arrival.
